## THE BEST BIRTHDAY PRESENT I EVER RECEIVED

Six years ago, on my birthday, I got the best present I never knew I needed. His name was Gunner. He didn't come wrapped in a bow - he came running out in front of my car on a lonely stretch of road, lost and afraid. You could tell he was searching for "his person" and had been spotted by many people for weeks. He wouldn't allow anyone to help him...until that day.



I'll never forget the moment. My heart jumped into my throat as I slammed on the brakes. When I got out, there he was - wide eyes, ribs showing, and a tail that wagged cautiously. He was leary of me. I knew he had been dumped, that he was scared and tired. Without thinking, I opened my car door and said "Load up, Let's go home". It took me saying that two times before he ran past me and jumped into my car, heading right for the front passenger seat. Even though I wasn't looking for another dog, in that moment he found his "person" and in my heart I knew he was mine.

From that day forward, Gunner was my shadow, my adventure buddy, my comfort on hard days, and my reminder that sometimes life brings you exactly what you need when you least expect it. He filled my home with muddy paw prints, fur on every piece of clothing I owned, and a kind of love that only a good dog can give. He greeted me at the door like I was his whole world, every single day, no matter how long I'd been gone. He taught me about loyalty, forgiveness, and finding joy in the simplest things. He was my BEST friend.

The day I lost him started like every other morning - with a walk before work. He stumbled and seemed tired and didn't want his treats when we got back...not even hotdogs which were his favorite. I thought he was feeling a little 'off' so I kissed him goodbye and told him to be a good boy until I got home. I got the call at 2pm that I needed to get home right away - something was really wrong with Gunner. As soon as I saw him, I knew. I could see it in his eyes, his breathing shallow, but his tail still wagged, just a little bit. It was the hardest call to make, but it was time. He needed me to be strong for him even as my heart was breaking in two.

I hope wherever he is now, he knows how loved he was - how loved he still is. I'm so grateful for every moment we had together. I'll cherish our early morning walks, his sloppy kisses, and the quiet moments when he laid his head in my lap and made the world feel okay as I petted his head. Thank you Gunner, for choosing me. You were the best dog I could've ever asked for, and I'll carry you and your love with me for the rest of my days.

## GET TO KNOW DUE COVER MODELS: THE RESCUE STORY OF ROMEO & JULIET

In 2019, one week before leaving on a three-week vacation, Keith and Annie Kendrick met a dog who would change their lives. Keith, a volunteer at SafeHaven, noticed Romeo immediately when he arrived on a transport from Oklahoma. Quiet and calm, Romeo stood out—not barking, just watching the world

with gentle eyes.

The Kendricks had lost their beloved dog, Peaches, to cancer only a month earlier. They knew they'd adopt again someday, but they hadn't expected it to happen so soon. Still, they couldn't pass up such a special dog. With their vacation looming, they arranged for friends to care for Romeo until they returned. By the time they came home, Romeo had spent more time with those friends than with them—but he quickly settled in as part of the family. Romeo enjoyed being the only dog for about a year, until another unexpected encounter brought Juliet into their lives.

While vacationing in Hawaii, the Kendricks visited the Kaua'i Humane Society. The shelter offered a "field trip" program where visitors could take dogs out for the day. Wanting to help, they asked to walk a pit bull—one of the most commonly overlooked types in shelters. That's when they met Crescent.

Crescent had clearly lived a rough life. Emaciated and dirty
from her time on the streets, she weighed only 36 pounds and
likely had puppies. Though subdued during their walk, she climbed into Keith's lap during the car ride

and rested her head out the window. She showed no interest in treats or toys, but something about her touched them deeply.

They hadn't planned on adopting another dog, but after spending just a few hours with her, they were smitten. The shelter, overwhelmed and over capacity, encouraged them to bring her back to the mainland. They agreed—and renamed her Juliet.

Today, Romeo and Juliet are thriving together. While Juliet has some behavioral challenges, including resource guarding and dog reactivity, Romeo is her perfect companion. With patience, training, and lots of love, Juliet has blossomed—and now weighs a healthy 53 pounds. The two dogs love snuggling on the couch, and Romeo has taken on the role of Juliet's personal therapy dog.

I visited him for a while and realized that he is a very laid back guy. This could work out! To be certain, I took him for a ride in the car and while we were driving I kept asking him, "Are you doing OK buddy?" After thinking about it overnight I went back to SafeHaven and told Buddy (his new name) to pack his bag, grab his toothbrush and say goodbye to his friends because he was heading to his forever home!

During that first week, I thought that perhaps he wasn't the right dog for me. He was very quiet and sedate. He didn't play with toys or interact with me. He didn't woof. I spoke to Chris at SafeHaven about this and she said to give him more time as the move was stressful for him. Now that we've been a family for months, he's made great strides! He may never be very demonstrative and that is ok with me. He has become more vocal (howling and not barking) and I like it. He even joins me in bed at night and that is OK, too.

He spends most of his time moving between sofas in the house and loves to ride in my car. He enjoys driving with the top down.

As I said in the beginning, this story has a happy ending. Buddy and I are a family and I tell him that several times a day. The moral to this story is to always give your fur babies a second or third or more chance. They can get as confused as we sometimes get. I cannot thank SafeHaven enough for urging me to give Buddy a second chance!



#### RINNI'S LONG ROAD TO FOREVER

Right before Thanksgiving last year, we adopted a beautiful German Shepherd named "Roxy" from SafeHaven. She turned seven years old on Thanksgiving day and we decided she needed a more fitting name for her regal nature. Inspired by the legendary Rin Tin Tin, we renamed her Rinni. Like her namesake, who was rescued from a World War I battlefield in France by an American solider and went on to star in 27 silent films, our Rinni is smart, resilient, and full of untold stories.



Rinni's journey to us was long and difficult. She began life as an unnamed breeding dog in Montana. Eventually, she was adopted by a young woman in Idaho, who loved her but eventually had to rehome her due to unforeseen circumstances. Rinni was entrusted to a kind man in Eastern Oregon handpicked by her previous owner—but when he was diagnosed with terminal cancer, Rinni was sent to a German Shepherd rescue group. In turn, they transfered her to SafeHaven, where luckily she stayed just three days before finding her way to us.

From the moment she arrived, we knew she had endured more than her fair share of hardship. Shy and emotionally fragile, she clung tightly to my wife, Burmah, and made it clear: she had found "her person". Over time, Rinni has begun to heal. She's still cautious with strangers, but with us, she's gentle, loyal, and loving. Her transformation has been nothing short of inspiring.

We believe Rinni is finally where she belongs. God willing, this is her forever home—and we're so thankful to be part of her story.



## **PETS ARE FAMILY**

#### AGAINST THE ODDS: HOW SAMSON KEPT HIS LEG THANKS TO COMPASSIONATE CARE & SAFEHAVEN SUPPORT

When four-month-old Samson was brought to his primary care veterinarian on March 11th, his family faced a heartbreaking situation: their playful pup had suffered a serious humeral fracture. The prognosis was daunting. Due to the complexity of stabilizing this type of break—particularly in such a young dog—surgical repair was not only risky, but prohibitively expensive. Amputation, although more affordable, seemed to be the only viable option to ensure Samson's comfort and quality of life.

Determined to do what was best for Samson, his family applied for assistance through SafeHaven's Pets Are Family Fund, which enabled them to pursue care at our onsite veterinary clinic, where costs could be more manageable. Surgery was scheduled for March 20th. But when Samson arrived, something unexpected happened—he was starting to use the injured leg.

After a thoughtful discussion and a careful physical exam, SafeHaven's veterinarian along with Samson's family made a bold decision: postpone the amputation and try conservative treatment with rest, sedatives, and close monitoring. Over the following weeks, Samson returned for multiple rechecks and follow-up X-rays.

Then came the moment we'd all hoped for. On May 8th, Samson's final X-rays showed complete healing. Against all odds, his leg was not only saved—it was fully functional.

Thanks to the Pets Are Family Fund, which covered all of Samson's exams and imaging, and the

dedication of his family and our veterinary team, Samson gets to run, play, and grow up on four healthy legs. His story is a testament to what can happen when compassion meets persistence—and when a little dog refuses to give up.

### **Pets Are Family Fund**

## LEAVING A LEGACY: Joan Marie Gerke

## SPECIAL...FOR MORE THAN JUST THEIR NEEDS

At SafeHaven, we have a special place in our hearts for special needs animals, like Dell, Scarlet Oak, and so many others!

At first glance, Dell may look a little different from other kittens. His front legs are a touch shorter than his back, his eyes never fully developed, and a heart murmur means his future is uncertain. But don't tell Dell any of that, because he certainly hasn't noticed. Dell charges through life like a pint-sized daredevil... who forgot to read the instructions. He barrels around the house at full kitten speed, only to run smack into walls, chairs, and sometimes his own foster mom's legs. New environments spook him easily, and his response is pure comedy: he instantly puffs up like a tiny, arched cartoon cat, ready to defend his honor against... a lamp.

Even though there's more supervision needed than an average 3-month-old kitten, Dell's foster mom is smitten with him, "low-key obsessed," she admits. And Dell is just as obsessed with her. When he isn't on a mission of chaotic exploration, he's glued to her side, purring like a little engine that never runs out of gas. Despite the challenges he was born with, Dell lives like any other kitten...playful, mischievous, and full of love. No one can say how long his journey will be, but one thing is certain: every day with Dell is a gift. His joyful spirit proves that a little imperfection doesn't make life any less beautiful, it just makes the love a little bigger.

Scarlet Oak started her journey as a tiny kitten rescued from the branches of an oak tree. From day one, she was a nonstop purr machine and an expert in snuggles. After a couple of successful weeks in foster care, Scarlet Oak was quicky adopted out with another kitten. As one of the kittens continued to grow and grow, Scarlet Oak wasn't growing like her sibling. She kept getting sick and couldn't keep food down. SafeHaven's medical team discovered she had megaesophagus, a condition that makes eating a real big challenge.

Her owners were afraid they couldn't give her the support she needed and brought her back to SafeHaven to receive the care she needed. So, the SafeHaven staff got to work building creative upright feeders and Scarlet Oak, true to form, purred through every attempt, but nothing was working. Then came a beautiful act of teamwork: a community member stepped in and donated special elevated bowls that changed everything for Scarlet Oak! Now she can eat safely, all while filling the room with her trademark purrs. She will always need a helping hand with feedings, but with help from her forever family and the help of gravity, Scarlet Oak has every chance to grow as big as her namesake.
