**Daytime Emergencies:** 7 days/week 7:30am-5pm | (541) 928-2789 ext. 106 | [fostercare@safehavenhumane.com](mailto:fostercare@safehavenhumane.com)

**After-Hours Emergencies:** SafeHaven does NOT have an after-hours or on-call veterinarian and is not able to provide medical care between the hours of 5pm-7:30am. In the event of a true emergency (in red below) after-hours, contact an emergency vet clinic below for treatment. Inform the clinic that the animal is a SafeHaven foster pet and the clinic will bill charges to SafeHaven.

Emergency		
Difficulty giving birth (active labor with more than 60 minutes between births)	Broken bones/sudden swelling/major trauma	Repeated attempts to vomit unsuccessfully in dogs (bloat)
Severe lacerations	Cold to the touch	Vomiting Blood
Severe lethargy/nonresponsive	Difficulty breathing	Toxic plant or substance ingestion
Seizures/staggering/incoordination	Fever 104.5 or higher	Bloated/distended abdomen in dogs (bloat)
Straining to urinate in male cats	Not eating/nursing less than 5 weeks old, severe diarrhea	Heat stroke

Urgent (email AND call daytime # – we will follow up the next business day if after-hours) If the animal continues to deteriorate, come to the shelter at 9am for assistance.		
Severe, leaking diarrhea (5+ weeks old)	Limping	More than 5 weeks old losing weight, not eating
Vomiting more than 2x	Straining to urinate	Minor injuries
Not eating	Bites that break skin	Lethargy
Puppy/kitten not latching well	Chewed/removed sutures	Deceased foster pet

Less Urgent (email/call daytime # – we will follow up the next business day)		
Broken nail	Vomiting 1-2x	Bloody stool
Weepy/swollen eyes	Ticks, fleas, intestinal parasites	Diarrhea
Nasal congestion/sneezing/discharge	Hair loss, skin lesions, itchy skin	Urinary accidents/frequent urination of small amounts
Coughing	“Happy tail”	Head shaking or scratching

We recommend you keep this information on your fridge for easy access!
