Dear Friends:

2024 is an exciting year for SafeHaven Humane Society! We will be celebrating 50 years of helping animals and the people that love them. What we have accomplished in those 50 years is nothing short of a miracle. Founded in 1974 by a small handful of dedicated and caring volunteers who cared deeply about helping neglected, abandoned, and abused animals in Linn County, SafeHaven has grown into a full-service humane society that not only helps animals in need, but has created programs and services to help people, as well.

I remember the first time I visited SafeHaven. I was a college student attending Oregon State University and I had found a tiny, dirty, sickly kitten in the basement of my apartment complex. I wasn't supposed to have pets, and this little guy was a screamer, so I tried to take him to a few other humane societies and was told due to his terrible upper respiratory infection, he would be euthanized.

When it came to animal welfare, I had lived a very sheltered life up until this point, but I knew that this little guy deserved a chance, so I drove out to the little shelter on Hwy 34 and gave my plea to please help him. The woman smiled, took him from me, and told him everything would be ok. She then took him to show him to another woman who was working her way through what seemed like miles and miles of laundry and dishes and asked her if she would be willing to foster him and help get him better.

Finding this tiny, sickly kitten and these two incredible women, started my journey into animal welfare. I began volunteering. I started to learn about animal abuse, neglect, and how many animals were being euthanized each year in the United States, and I learned about humane societies and the human-animal bond. My path in life was slowly changing. Ten years later, I followed my heart, and made the decision to join SafeHaven Humane Society as a staff member (I was one of three paid staff at the time).

As I look back at all the memories, our history, our challenges and successes, I see the faces of so many people and pets that have shared our past and who have helped shape who we are today. We will continue to do all we can for animals that need us. From rescue to adoption, to community programs and medical care of owned pets, SafeHaven is committed to making a difference each and every day.

This commitment is because of you! Your support, kindness, and caring are truly what our history is all about. Thank you on behalf of all the animals you have saved. Thank you for saving that tiny, sickly kitten many years ago, and thank you for believing in the work we are doing.

Flower came to SafeHaven completely paralyzed in her rear limbs and with a severe wound to her left abdomen and flank. Her wound is now completely healed. Her rear limb paralysis is due to multiple fractures and dislocation of her thoracic vertebrae. She has had some mild improvement in her rear limb paralysis with acupuncture and herbal treatments, but currently she wears diapers and may have to for the rest of her life.

Lily and Lucy were two of our more long-term doggos here at SafeHaven and we were all so excited when a couple took the two of them home together in August! We recently heard from their adopters, and this is what they had to say:

"Despite some tiny little glitches, we think things are going wonderfully with the girls. Because we had no fences when we adopted them, they were not allowed to be off leash. We fenced off a fairly large area as quickly as we could, put a large piece of

carpet In it, and it is equipped with heavy rope to hang

a tarp for shade.



Now they can be off leash and play as often as they like. We have enjoyed them knowing a few simple commands such as 'no' and 'sit.' We have concerned ourselves mostly with forming a loving bond with them which means when I take an afternoon nap, Lucy sleeps with me. We are pleased with how alert they are to their environment. We like how they alert us to people who drive by as we're a bit isolated and like to know what's going on in our area. We work on desensitizing some of their fears such as Lily being afraid of the flyswatter. We have flies and flying ants in our area, so she is getting used to hearing the slap of the swatter."


