Despite it all, he's easygoing and affectionate. He flinched at first, but quickly warmed up. He's gentle, food-motivated, and loves people. He deserves love and kindness."



As I read, my heart has already decided: **SafeHaven will help him.**

These are the pleas we receive every day. These are the eyes we see; pleading, hopeful, waiting for someone to notice, to care, to say "yes". Today, because of your generosity, I could say yes to Butterball. **Because of you, we can spread joy. Because of you, we can save lives.**

FROM OUR COVER MODEL, HOPE


I hoped for a better life...

And before I knew it, I was on a plane from Mexico, bound for the start of my new life at SafeHaven.




I hoped that someone would notice...

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: Reid Veterinary Hospital



SPREADING JOY & SAVING LIVES comes naturally to the wonderful team at Reid Veterinary Hospital. We are so grateful to them for always answering the call when one of our SafeHaven animals is in need, like Hope. And Hallows...and the countless others they have helped save all year long!

This is Hallows!

You wouldn't know it by looking at this silly picture, but this sweet boy was on death's doorstep - not once, but twice!

Both Hallows and his sister were scheduled for euthanasia in California before SafeHaven swooped in and saved them. Upon their arrival, these two spirited companions were full of energy, playfulness, and a thirst for adventure. However, just days later their health took a concerning turn. Hallows' sister, Eve, was struggling with gastrointestinal issues, and spent two days on fluids, but bounced back quickly afterwards. Hallows on the other hand continued to decline; we could see that he was trying to eat but just couldn't...not even the special boiled chicken that the staff was making him. An ultrasound revealed that he was suffering from intussusception, a serious condition where the intestine folds in on itself, causing a blockage, and was going to need surgery. One phone call to Reid Veterinary Hospital and Hallows was scheduled for his surgery the very next day.

Hallows' surgery was a success, and he is now recovering comfortably in a loving foster home. His foster dad says that he is "bouncing off the ceiling" - just like any other puppy!


He still wrestles with his younger siblings on occasion and enjoys patrolling the backyard at night before coming in for a nice snuggle on the couch.

HANK: FROM ABANDONED STRAY TO OUR BEST FRIEND!

We're the Kochs - Henry (AKA Hank the Human), Hope, and most importantly, Hank the Dog. And no, we didn't give him that name - he came with it.


Hank's early story is a bit of a mystery, but we know he was found wandering the streets of California. He was in and out of a shelter being adopted and returned multiple times - through no fault of his own. Then, due to the wildfires in California at the time, Hank was moved again...this time to SafeHaven! There he was pampered, dressed in silly costumes, and featured on their Facebook page. That's where we first saw him: a pure white, gentle-eyed 9-month old we believe is a Great Pyrenees/Lab mix.

We were hesitant about getting a dog at first, but when SafeHaven staff visited my workplace to prepare for Rescue Roundup, everyone raved about Hank - *"He's the sweetest!"*, *"He's the best!"* - we knew we had to meet him. At the shelter, he didn't chase toys or try to play, he just wandered around quietly, content and quirky. We fell for him instantly and brought him home that day.

We soon learned Hank had severe separation anxiety. In just nine months, we were the seventh place he'd lived, and being left alone terrified him. He destroyed kennels, ripped door frames off the wall, even bent the bars on an "anxiety-proof" crate. With full-time jobs and school, we had moments of doubt - he was the sweetest dog when someone was with him, and panicked the moment we left. But we stuck with him. With patience and consistency, Hank finally learned he was safe.



A year later, Hank knows he's home. As I write this, he's lounging on the couch next to me, ignoring his two giant dog beds. We can leave him loose and trust he won't destroy a thing - because this is his home now, too.

Today, Hank is a "water-adjacent" dog - he hates getting wet but loves paddleboarding. He enjoys long walks, fishing trips, befriending every stranger and dog he meets, and occasional pup cups. From abandoned stray to our best friend, Hank's transformation has been incredible to witness.



The Rule of **THREE**

Adopting a pet is a special moment. The excitement of bringing a new best friend into your life can also bring big expectations about what our relationship should look and feel like.

Hank's story is a good reminder that from the first meeting, to years of companionship and adventures, lasting love takes time, patience, and space to grow.

To help set up realistic expectations from adoption to building the foundation of a lasting relationship, behavior experts recommend the 3-3-3 rule:

3 DAYS TO DECOMPRESS

3 WEEKS TO ESTABLISH A ROUTINE

3 MONTHS TO FEEL AT HOME

While the 3-3-3 rule is a helpful guideline, every animal is different - it's all about being patient and providing consistency when you bring a new animal home. Adopting an animal is one of life's most rewarding moments, but nothing is sweeter than the relationship you discover over time.

DONOR SPOTLIGHT:

Rebecca Swanson



When thinking about the theme of this newsletter, Rebecca has been **SPREADING JOY & SAVING LIVES** as a SaveHaven donor for many years. We asked Rebecca why it was that she chose to support SafeHaven and this is what she had to say:

I've always had a soft spot for animals and grew up bringing home strays - thank goodness my parents didn't object! I guess it's no surprise that all my pets have been rescues.

My initial interaction with SafeHaven was when we adopted our first of 2 rescue cats from the old shelter on Hwy 34. My good friend (and SafeHaven Board member) Osalyn Houser, told me about Maxx, a beatiful boy weighing in at 22-lbs. His claim to fame was being "Mr. August" in the 2015 SafeHaven calendar - he loved being in the spotlight. We lost Maxx to kidney failure several years ago, but the love he brought us will stay with us forever. Then, during COVID, we adopted Minnie, a gorgeous calico with a HUGE pesonality that makes us laugh every day!



Years ago, I was invited to join the SafeHaven board. Although I couldn't serve then, I volunteered to work on any special projects that came up. The idea for the tree raffle came about after I entered a tree in a Festival of Trees contest in Corvallis. While that particular event wasn't ongoing, I thought a raffle would be a fun holiday fundraiser, so I pitched the idea to SafeHaven. **Now, 11 years later, the Christmas Tree raffle has raised over \$100,000 for the animals at SafeHaven, one \$50 raffle ticket at a time!** This year might be the last year of the raffle, but not the last year of me wanting to do something special for the animals.

With the raffle coming to an end, but still wanting to make a difference for the animals, I talked with SafeHaven about where a donation would serve the greatest need at the shelter. I was shown the exercise area for the dogs which would require a lot of work to make it a more pleasant and practical area for exercising the dogs. I was ALL IN! The funds are being used to make **THE SWANSON 'SNIFF & STROLL' DOG PARK** a reality!

Someone once said "If we have the ability to give, we have a responsibility to give". Helping these animals - who have no voice and no choice - truly makes my heart happy.

WE HELP PETS AND PEOPLE

Pet Therapy Visits

SafeHaven's Pet Therapy program involves scheduled visits with adoptable animals to senior living facilities, Alzheimer's care units, and rehabilitation centers.

These weekly outings on Tuesday mornings provide residents with meaningful interactions and health benefits associated with spending time with animals, such as:

- Increased comfort & emotional well-being
- Reducing loneliness
- Improving social engagement
- Elevating cognitive function

We can't think of four animals more deserving of having their life changed by finding their forever family.




I'm Millie!


